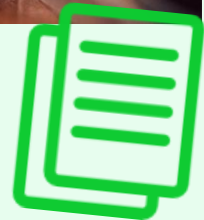

SAFETY FLASH: PERMIT TO WORK

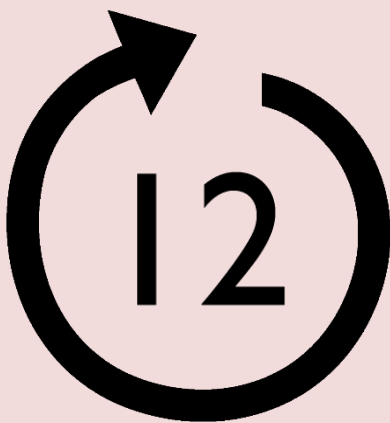
GOOD PRACTICE

Use a permit to work when:

- 👍 Doing hot work;
- 👍 Working in a confined/enclosed space;
- 👍 Doing maintenance with lifting operations;
- 👍 Doing maintenance with diving activities;
- 👍 Doing maintenance when working at height;
- 👍 Doing maintenance on electricity;
- 👍 Doing maintenance on critical equipment;
- 👍 Doing maintenance in the pump room;
- 👍 Doing activities outside the railing;
- 👍 Activities are done by 2 or more parties.



A permit to work is used to set the terms for a safe working environment in order to execute activities safely, with the goal to prevent accidents.



BAD PRACTICE

- ✗ Filling in the permit to work by yourself.
- ✗ Not filling in the permit to work (completely).
- ✗ Not informing the crew.
- ✗ Not taking any measures.
- ✗ Working for more than 12 hours under the permit to work.
